Who Provides O-RAP Consultation?

Suggested Areas for O-RAP Review

New Program Development—evaluate the potential for starting an osteopathic family practice residency based on an institutional and community assessment.

Across-the-Board Review—examine curriculum, facilities, finances, recruiting practices, and compliance among other areas to establish a baseline for current practices—a baseline against which you can measure anticipated quality improvement.

Faculty Development—identify ways to enhance the training skills and provide institutional leadership in developing residents and providing quality care to patients.

Financial Assessment—put your program’s revenue sources and expense areas under a microscope, yielding recommendations for fiscal stability and growth.

Patient-Centered Evaluation—refine your program’s administrative effectiveness and determine your institutional readiness for implementing the “medical home” concept.

Program Impact—quantify your program’s contributions to the institution’s fiscal stability as well as the impact on public health in your community.

O-RAP Consulting Fees

Fees for O-RAP consulting services vary based on the evaluation’s scope, but generally can be estimated at approximately \$2,500 to cover pre-consultation preparation, on-site visit including consultant travel and hotel accommodations, and development of the written report.
